About The Florence Project

The Florence Project was founded in 1989 to respond to a representation crisis for indigent non-citizens detained at the rural Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) Detention Center in Florence, Arizona. Through our programs today, we provide services to the more than 4,000 men, women, and children detained in Eloy, Florence, Phoenix, and Tucson, Arizona on any given day. In 2001, the Florence Project implemented our Integrated Social Services Program, one of the first of its kind in this field. The Florence Project provides high quality legal and social services and supports initiatives for national changes in immigration law and policy.

Placement/ Internship Description

The social services team along with the outreach and development team is seeking a MSW intern for Macro social work projects in Tucson. The student will work on the outreach and development strategies implemented by the Florence Project. The intern will be supervised by the social services team, but will work daily with the Outreach and Development team. Students will complete the following tasks, with some flexibility depending on the requirements of your MSW program and your interests.

- Help facilitate outreach events such as family unity trainings, legal orientation presentations, etc.
- Help facilitate fundraising events
- Grant research, development, and writing
- Assist in communication development
- Meet with former clients and writing their stories to be used in campaigns
- Call donors and/or volunteers to thank them for their support

REQUIREMENTS

- Must be able to pass a background check
- Must be in an MSW program or related field
- Proficiency in Spanish preferred
- Commitment to immigrant rights, social justice, or human rights issues and ardent support of the Florence Project's mission.
- Preferred experience working with community outreach and development
- An independent hard working team player with a sense of humor who is flexible, patient, and respectful
- Preferred knowledge of Adobe software and familiarity with social media platforms

Application Process

Candidates will be considered on an ongoing basis. To apply, email your resume, writing sample and a letter of interest which includes the opportunities you are interested in, the length of your commitment, your school, and year of school to jobs@firrp.org, with "Social Services Internship" in the subject line. Applicants will be interviewed by telephone, or in person if possible. The Florence Project values diversity in the workplace and strongly encourages applications from people of color, LGBTQ individuals, persons with disabilities and members of under-represented communities.
